Through Bishop Barron's writing he urges the brothers and sisters of the Church to "stay and fight on behalf of themselves and their families and especially for the victims of the abuse." The Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary September 8



The feast of the

Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary occurs nine months after December 8, the feast of the Immaculate Conception. The earliest document commemorating this feast comes from a hymn written in the sixth century. The originated feast may have somewhere in Syria or Palestine in the beginning of the sixth century. when after the Council of Ephesus, the cult of the Mother of God was greatly intensified, especially in Syria.

Since the story of Mary's Nativity is known only from apocryphal sources, the Latin Church was slow in adopting this festival. At Rome the Feast began to be kept toward the end of the 7th century, brought there by Eastern monks.

The winegrowers in France called this feast "Our Lady of the Grape Harvest". The best grapes are brought to the local church to be blessed and then some bunches are attached to the hands of the statue of Mary. A festive meal that includes the new grapes is part of this day.

Saint Augustine connects Mary's birth with Jesus' saving work. He tells the earth to rejoice and shine forth in the light of her birth. "She is the flower of the field from whom bloomed the precious lily of the valley. Through her birth the nature inherited from our first parents is changed."

Did You Know?



While Pope Paul VI's trip to the US in 1965 was the first time a pontiff set foot in the

United States, he was not the first Pope to set foot on American territory. That honor goes to Pope Pius IX in 1849! Legally a nation's warships are considered sovereign territory. To walk the decks of an American naval vessel is to tread on American "soil."

On August 2, 1849, Captain John Gwinn of the USS Constitution (Old Ironsides) anchored the ship at Gaeta, a town just north of Naples, Italy. His reason for the visit was to call upon Pope Pius IX.

In November 1848 the Minister of Justice of the Papal had been assassinated. The next day, the people of Rome took to the streets demanding a variety of social reforms, democratic government, and an immediate declaration of war against the Austrian Empire (which then occupied Italy). The following week, Pope Pius IX slipped out of Rome disguised as a country priest and took up residence at Gaeta. where Ferdinand. King of the Two Sicilies, had powerful а stronghold.

According to the log book, of the USS Constitution at 11:15 on August 2, "His Holiness Pope Pius IX and His Majesty Ferdinand II, King of the two Sicilies visited the ship – (we) manned the yards and saluted each with 21 guns on their arrival on board and also on their departure from the ship."

In a letter to his wife, Capt. Gwinn explained that the Catholics on board had been blessed by the Pope on the gundeck, and that he had distributed rosaries to the faithful. Gwinn himself received a picture of Pius IX.

Pope Pius IX eventually returned to the Vatican in 1850 with the help of the French Army. He lived until February 1878, making him the longest serving elected pope in Papal history (32 years!).
