## St. Denis Bishop and Martyr October 9 ?-270 AD

St. Denis was born and raised in Italy,



he was sent as a missionary to Gaul (now France) circa 250 A.D. by Pope St. Clement.

Denis made his base of missionary activity an island in the Seine near the city of Lutetia Parisorium -- what would become Paris. He is known as the first bishop of Paris and Apostle of France. There he was captured by the Parisians.

After a long imprisonment and several aborted execution attempts, Denis was beheaded with a sword on the highest hill in Paris (now Montmartre).

After his head was cut off, Denis is said to have picked it up and walked several miles from the summit of the hill, preaching a sermon the entire way. The site where he stopped preaching and actually died and was buried was marked by a small shrine that developed into the Saint Denis Basilica, which became the burial place for the kings of France.

Denis is pictured as he was martyred -- headless and carrying his own mitred head.

Recognized since the time of St. Gregory as a special saint of Paris, Denis is the patron saint of France. His feast day is **October 9.** He is also recognized as one of the Fourteen Holy Helpers.
