Can you believe Labor Day weekend is upon us? It almost appears we're back to normal, kids are in school, high school football began, the MLB is in full swing, the NFL season is about to kick off! I even received my zoom invite for TMIY. All seems back to normal! However, that couldn't be farther from the truth. COVID IS STILL HERE! Society is adapting and changing to hopefully preventing the spread of COVID. The Knights of Columbus is also changing and adapting too. As you know we have been doing zoom meetings, since March and yet we remain resilient continuing our works of mercy and charity, completing programs as best we can. If you hadn't heard, our Measure Up program was most successful, collecting more than \$3400.

Over the weekend we have mailed out our Football This Frenzv Cards. is an awesome opportunity to earn money for our Charity Fund! Not only we will we receive a rebate for each card sold, but we have an opportunity to have our per Capita fees waived, if we can sell our quota of just 96 Cards. The cards ask for a donation of \$20, which equates to just \$2 per week to play, and the payout equals 23

chances to win weekly. There will be a guaranteed payout, even if the NFL doesn't play. Each member has received 4 cards to purchase or sell. Do the best you can do, despite the surrounding circumstances of COVID. Ask a sibling, or an adult child, a friend or coworker, a neighbor a best friend here in the Parish. It's a little bit of entertainment, a chance at a little competition to win. If you can't get out and sell any, I ask you to at least purchase a minimum of the one card. Thank you. We now have 90 Knights, so if you at least sent in the one, we should make our quota and save the per Capita fees and the rebate would be \$9 per card for our Council. That is an excellent start.

As of Tuesday the officers and Program Directors met to schedule this year's calendar of events. The prior week, I took the training regarding the Programs. The presenters discussed selecting the Programs that best fit the talents of Council's members. I couldn't help but think of the Psalm that tells us "Lord, You know me. Why did He bestow that talent to you, and how can that talent be utilized to better serve Him and others?" Holy Archangels: Saints Michael, Gabriel and Raphael September 29



September 29th celebrates the feast of three archangels who are venerated in the tradition of the Church. Michael (Who is like God?) was the archangel who fought against Satan and all his evil angels, defending all the friends of God. He is the protector of all humanity from the snares of the devil. Gabriel (Strength of God) announced to Zachariah the forthcoming birth of John the Baptist, and to Mary, the birth of Jesus. His greeting to the Virgin, "Hail, full of grace," is one of the most familiar and frequent prayers of the Christian people. Raphael (Medicine of God) is the archangel who took care of Tobias on his journey.

Angels are pure, created spirits. The name angel means servant or messenger of God. Angels are heavenly beings, on a higher order than human beings. Angels have intellect and will, and are immortal. They are a vast multitude, but each is an individual person. Prior to 1969 September 29 used to be the Feast of St. Michael alone. It was known as **Michaelmas Day**.

Folklore in the British Isles suggests that Michaelmas Day is the last day that blackberries can be picked. It is said that when St. Michael expelled Satan from heaven, he fell from the skies and landed in a prickly blackberry bush. Satan cursed the fruit, scorched them with his fiery breath, and stamped and spat on them, so that they would be unfit for eating. A traditional Irish proverb says: On Michaelmas Day the devil puts his foot on the blackberries.

Welcome! to our newest member Brother Daniel Hageman, who is a transfer to the OLP Council from the St. Michael's Council.





Venerable Father Michael **McGivney** and the Virus

Venerable Father Michael McGivney,



the founder of the Knights of Columbus, died of pneumonia on August 14, 1890.

According to an article on the Vatican News website there is speculation that he may have died as the result of a pandemic.

The 1889-1890 pandemic, also known as the "Asiatic Flu" or "Russian Flu", was a deadly pandemic that killed about 1 million people worldwide (about 13,000 died in the US). It was the last great pandemic of the 19th century.

Not only is there evidence that he died as a result of a pandemic, but a 2005 genomic study speculates that the 1890 virus might not have been a pandemic of the influenza virus, pandemic of human but a Coronavirus.

In these difficult times, many are looking for help to make sense of it all. The time-honored Catholic tradition of invoking men and women of proven holiness to intercede with the Father for us offers one path toward peace and deeper faith in God. With that in mind, perhaps Venerable Father Michael McGivney is a good option for our prayers.

Also, please note that Father McGivney is expected to be beautified on October 31, 2020 at his home parish in Connecticut. He will then be Blessed Father Michael McGivney, the final step before sainthood.
