Pope St. Martin I Martyr 590-655 April 13

Pope Martin

I, also known

as Martin the



Confessor, was the Bishop of Rome from July 21, 649 to his death. He served as Pope Theodore I's ambassador to Constantinople and was elected to succeed him as Pope.

He was the only pope during the Eastern Roman domination of the Papacy whose election was not approved by an imperial mandate from Constantinople.

For his strong opposition to the heresy of Monothelitism (a heresy, strongly supported in the East, held that Christ had no human will), Pope Martin I was arrested by Emperor Constans II, carried off to Constantinople, and ultimately banished to Cherson, in the southern Crimea, where he died from imprisonment, torture and famine. He was a martyr who stood up for the right of the Church to establish doctrine even in the face of imperial power. **He was the Iast of the Popes to die a Martyr**.

He is considered a saint by the Catholic Church and by the Eastern Orthodox Church.





Our Parish History



In the spring of 1953 construction began on the new Our Lady of Peace church/gym, which was connected to the rear of the new school building. The new Our Lady of Peace church/gym was blessed Sunday, December 20, 1953 by Columbus Bishop Michael J. (above) immediately Ready preceding a Pontifical High Mass offered by the Bishop in the new building. The church was constructed at the rear of the school building. The new building cost \$80,000 and would seat 500. The temporarv church/gym replaced a wooden army barracks that had served as the parish church since 1946. The parish continued to use the new church/gym until December 10, 1967 when the present Church was officially dedicated by Columbus John Bishop J. Carberry.
