St. Enda of Aran Irish Abbot and Monk ? – 530 AD March 21

born in Ireland and the son of a lord of a large territory in the north of Ireland. According to legend, he was a military man, known for his great feats and fierceness in battle. His sister, Saint Fanchea, abbess of Killaine, convinced him to leave the army, settle down, and marry. Taking her advice, he went to his fiancée only to find out she had died while he was away in battle.

Enda decided to live out the remainder of his life as a monk.

Later he traveled to Rome, and was eventually ordained a priest. When he returned to Ireland, he built churches at Drogheda in County Louth.

Since his brother-in-law was King Oengus of Munster, Enda requested from him the island of Aran, the largest of three islands off the western coast of County Galway, where he built a great monastery.

So many pious disciples were trained in the monastery that the island came to be called "Aran of the Saints." Ten other churches were built there.

Along with Saint Finnian of Clonard, Enda is considered the founder of monasticism in Ireland. His feast day is March 21.

Today, St. Enda is the patron saint of the Aran Islands. In fact, each of the three islands was a center of monasticism and learning in the early Middle Ages and was home to numerous saints, both men and women.
