Message from the Grand Knight

We

completed our Officer installation in July with several of our wives investing their spouses with their perspective jewel! The setting was the church with our District Deputy Richard Wade presiding. It was a beautiful and meaningful event, as we professed our vows to serve the Council before God and Family. The ceremony was followed by а nice gathering. It was good to be together in person, after such a long time apart. Our third principle is Fraternity, a big part of who we are. I am hoping we will soon begin to see more Brother Knights at our meetings.

Over the course of August I am planning to work individually with each program director to ascertain the Programs we plan to complete and scheduling of the event.

Once the schedule is in place I will email this schedule to you. I ask you to prayerfully discern one event, whether it be Family, Community, Life or Faith. Put that event on your calendar and participate when it comes around.

Recall our second principle, Unity. Each of us individually represents a single fiber that together binds a cord. The strength of that cord (our

St. Maximilian Mary Kolbe Priest and Martyr 1894-1941 August 14



Saint

Maximilian Kolbe was born on January 8, 1894, in Poland. Kolbe was very active in promoting the Immaculate Virgin Mary and is as the Apostle known Consecration to Mary. Much of his life was influenced by a vision he had of the Virgin Mary when he was 12. "That night I asked the Mother of God what was to become of me. Then she came to me holding two crowns, one white, the other red. She asked me if I was willing to accept either of these crowns. The white one meant that I should persevere in purity and the red that I should become a martyr. I said that I would accept them both."

One year after his vision, Kolbe joined the Conventual Franciscans. In 1911, he professed his first vows. At the age of 21, Kolbe earned a doctorate in philosophy from the Pontifical Gregorian University. At 28 he earned a doctorate in theology.

In 1918, he was ordained a priest and continued his work of promoting Mary throughout Poland. Over the next several years, Kolbe took on publishing. He founded a monthly periodical titled, Knight of the Immaculate. He also founded a new Conventual Franciscan monastery Niepokalanow, which became a major religious publishing center. Kolbe also founded monasteries in both Japan and India. To this day, the monastery in Japan remains prominent in the Roman Catholic Church in Japan.

In 1936, Kolbe's health forced him to return to Poland, and once the WWII invasion by Germany began, he became one of the only brothers to remain in the monastery. He opened up a

temporary hospital to aid those in need. Kolbe refused to sign a document that would recognize him as a German citizen and continued to provide shelter for refugees - including hiding 2,000 Jews from German persecution.

On February 17, 1941, the monastery closed; Kolbe was arrested by the German Gestapo and taken to Pawiak prison. Three months later, he was transferred to Auschwitz. Kolbe was the victim to severe violence and harassment. Toward the end of his second month in Auschwitz, 10 men were chosen to face death by starvation as a warning to others against escapes. Kolbe was not chosen initially but volunteered to take the place of a man with a family.

It is said during the last days of his life Kolbe led prayers to Our Lady with the prisoners. He was the last of the group of 10 to remain alive, after two weeks of dehydration and starvation. The guards gave him a lethal injection of carbolic acid. St. Maximilian Kolbe died on August 14, 1941 and his remains were cremated on August 15, the same day as the feast of the Assumption of Mary.

Kolbe was canonized as a saint by Pope John Paul II on October 10, 1982. Franciszek Gajowniczek, the man Kolbe saved at Auschwitz, survived the Holocaust and was present at the canonization ceremonies. His feast day is August 14.
