Feast of Our Lady of Mt. Carmel July 16



Hermits lived on Mount Carmel

near the Fountain of Elijah in northern Israel in the 12th century. They had a chapel dedicated to Our Lady. By the 13th century they became known as “Brothers of Our Lady of Mount Carmel.” They soon celebrated a special Mass and Office in honor of Mary.

In 1726, the Mass became a celebration of the universal Church under the title of **Our Lady of Mount Carmel**. For centuries the Carmelites have seen themselves as specially related to Mary. Their great saints and theologians have promoted devotion to her and often championed the mystery of her Immaculate Conception.

There is a tradition—which may not be historical—that Mary appeared to **Saint Simon Stock**, a leader of the Carmelites, and gave

him a scapular, telling him to promote devotion to it. The scapular is a modified version of Mary’s own garment. It symbolizes her special protection and calls the wearers to consecrate themselves to her in a special way. The scapular reminds us of the gospel call to prayer and penance—a call that Mary models in a splendid way.

Knights of Columbus Day with the Columbus Clippers




The Grand Knight has arranged a **KofC Day with the Columbus Clippers**. They will be playing the **Indianapolis Indians**.

St. Aloysius Seminary, Columbus, Ohio



The first seminary of the Diocese of Columbus, named St. Aloysius Seminary, was founded in **1873** by **Bishop Sylvester Rosecrans** (pictured).

It was in a large old residence on the site of the present old Holy Family School in Franklinton. Its president was a diocesan priest, **Father Nicholas Gallagher**, who later became the 2nd Bishop of Galveston, Texas.

The teachers at the seminary were Bishop Rosecrans, who had formerly taught Theology at Mt. St. Mary's Seminary in Cincinnati, and other priests of the diocese. It educated about 35 students each year. Bishop Rosecrans was forced to close St. Aloysius due to a financial crisis in 1876.

Twelve priests of the diocese received part of their education at St. Aloysius. Among these was **James J. Hartley**, the fourth Bishop of Columbus. He named **St. Aloysius Parish** on the Hilltop in memory of the seminary when the parish was founded in 1906. It was also Bishop Hartley who founded the second diocesan seminary, **St. Charles**, the present preparatory school, in 1923.

After closing the 1871 seminary building it became the convent for the **Sisters of St. Joseph**.
